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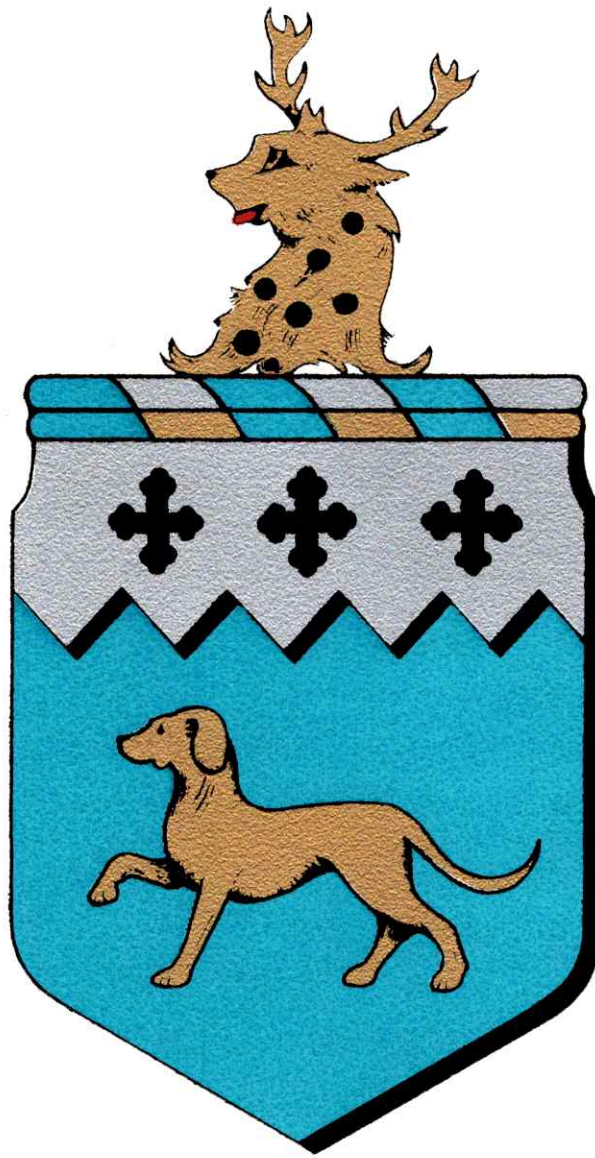

Arms: Azure, a talbot passant or, on a chief indented argent, 3 crosses crosslet sable.

Crest: A hind's head or, pellettee.

Interpretation: A golden animal, three feet on the ground; the fourth foot raised, on the shield background of blue, with three multiple black crosses on a silver band across the top.

The Crest: A golden hind's head with black pellets.

The reason for the use of these placements and mythical figures as arranged in the achievement are unknown. There may have been an interesting story from which the original coat of arms was patterned.

These highly prized armorial achievements had a humble origin. Fighting men of the Middle Ages wore whatever they could scrape together. The more fortunate, wore shirts of chain mail thickly padded inside and out for protection, a long surcoat of cloth covered the entire outfit. Attired in armor of a sort, with helmet and shield, the fighting man was not easily recognized in battle. Need for identification arose. Dabs of paint and crude signs were put on the front and back of the surcoat for easier recognition and thus it was that the first coat of arms was developed. It was considered second only in importance to the invention of the stirrup.

Think of the complete coat of arms or armorial achievement as a person in armor. It consists of three parts, the shield, crest and motto. The shield is the basic element, often the complete coat of arms, and seen as such is probably a very old one, they became more elaborate as time passed.

The colors used in the Keen coat of arms denote great attributes:

Argent (silver).....justice, purity, peace.
Or (gold).....generosity and elevation of mind.
Azure (blue).....Loyalty, truth, devotion.
Sable (black)Constancy.

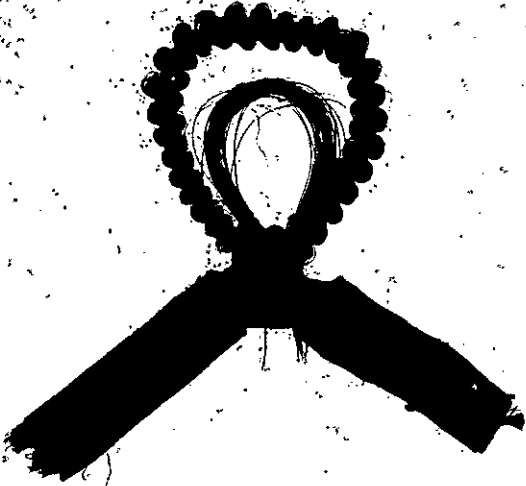

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FOREWORD

The name of Keane, Kean, Keene or Keen is generally believed to have been originally used as a nickname, having reference to the quick or keen brains of its first bearers, but it is also possible that some of the families of the name took their patronymics from the parish of Keyne, in County Cornwall, England. It is found in the ancient English records in the various forms of Kene, Kein, Keine, Kyne, Kien, Keyne, Keayne, Keayn and numerous others, of which the four mentioned at the beginning of this article are those most frequently used in America today. It is also worthy of note that at least one branch of the American family of the name is said to have descended from a Swedish family of the name of Kijn or Kyn.

In Hezekiah Keen's Account Book, now the property of the Massachusetts Society of Mayflower Descendants, he claims his grandfather was born in England on London Bridge, that this grandfather, Josiah Keen came out of England with his father and mother, John and Martha Keen and settled in Boston, then Hingham, then Meshfeld. Our story starts then with John Keen who was a Mariner and Innholder and who came from England aboard the "Confidence" in 1638 with his wife Martha and their children. Martha died aboard the "Confidence."

The spelling of the name "Keene" from "Keen" was a transition which may have occurred during the Zebulon III period.

P R E F A C E

This account of the DESCENDANTS of John Keen of England has been compiled by Edith Susannah Dougherty Keene (deceased) and Archie Timothy Keene with the aid of Cleo Goff Wilkens, Genealogist. Grateful recognition is extended to all who have made contributions. This record may not be a complete accounting of the John Keen family but an outline has been established to which it is hoped others will contribute. The original purpose of the study was to learn the names of the earliest ancestors in the Zebulon Keen line in America and to discover from whence they came. This has been accomplished. A visit to the Town Hall in Pembroke, Mass. divulged the names of his parents, their children, other pertinent vital statistics for Zebulon and resulted in learning of his ascendants back to John Keen, the original immigrant. These many descendants were and are folks with various vocations, such as carpenters, coopers, mechanics, merchants, military personnel, ministers, educators, lawyers, farmers, doctors, engineers, executives, etcetera. They, like other people in these early periods, traveled and settled to the West; they were courageous, creative, productive and religious. Many of their children were given Biblical names.

For about fifty years considerable enthusiasm has been manifested for completion of this project by the Keene Family Reunion of Valparaiso, Indiana. This group first met and was organized in the summer of 1921 when a small family gathering was held on the farm of Ed. Stone Keene, in the Keene Homestead, it having been the home of his father, Timothy and that of his grandfather, Sprague. Plans were made for a yearly reunion to serve as a base of operation to encourage study leading to the creation of a Family History. Temporary officers were appointed: President, Elmer Morton Keene, Vice President, Mrs. Charles Wharton Hall; Secretary, Archie Timothy Keene; Treasurer, Mrs. May Galloway.

At the first reunion, one year later there were 98 descendants present, representing 30 families from 5 states.

NUMBERING SYSTEM

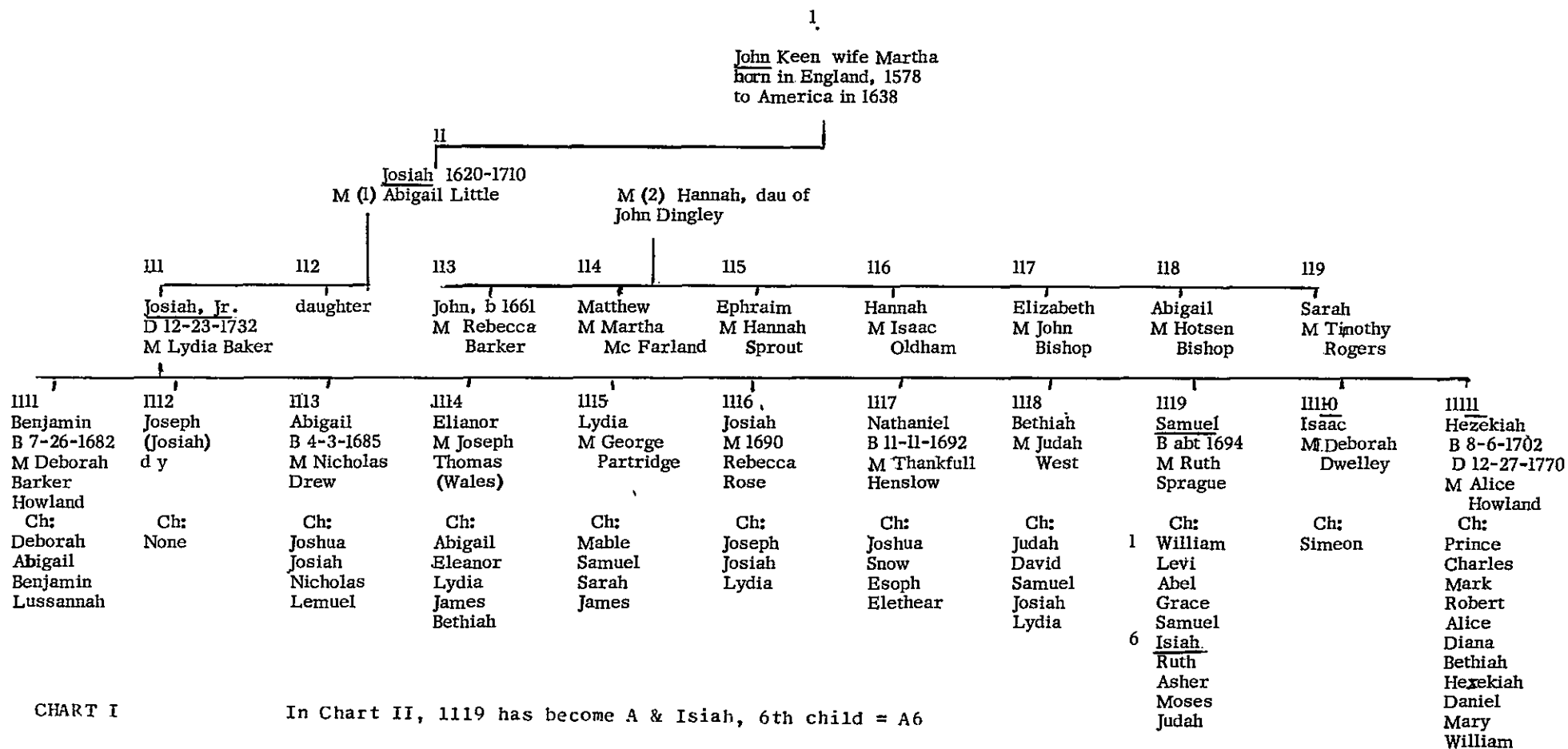
A digit is allowed for each generation, thus John Keen becomes 1, his children 1-1, 1-2, 1-3 respectively, written 11, 12, 13 for simplicity. Where the children in one family exceed nine, the numbers 10, 11, etcetera are underscored to indicate one generation only. To shorten the lengthy numbering, the first four generations abbreviate to A, as in Chart II. The second four generations to AB, AF and AH as shown in Charts III and IV, the different capitals indicating a particular family group in it's eighth generation. By dropping the right hand digits, one at a time, ones ancestry can be traced back thru it's entire lineage to the original immigrant, John Keen.

KEEN(E) GENEALOGY

- 1 John Keen, immigrant, Mariner and Inn-Holder, settled in Hingham, earliest name recorded in America, was born in England in 1578, died 1649, wife Martha 1578-1638. They came to America with five children in 1638 aboard the "Confidence," on which Martha died in 1638. They were the parents of Josiah, Elizabeth, Martha, John and Sarah.

- 11 Josiah, 1620-1710, born in London on London Bridge, came with his parents (leaving two brothers behind) to Boston, "Hengham" and "Mishfield." He married 1st Abigail Little, daughter of Thomas and Anna (Warren) (p 64) Little; granddaughter of Richard and Elizabeth (Juett) (Marsh) Warren. Warren was a Mayflower Passenger, see later account. Abigail Little, first wife of Josiah, died shortly after the birth of her second child, a daughter who died young. They had one son, Josiah, Jr. Josiah married second, Hannah, dau of John Dingley, by whom he had seven children:

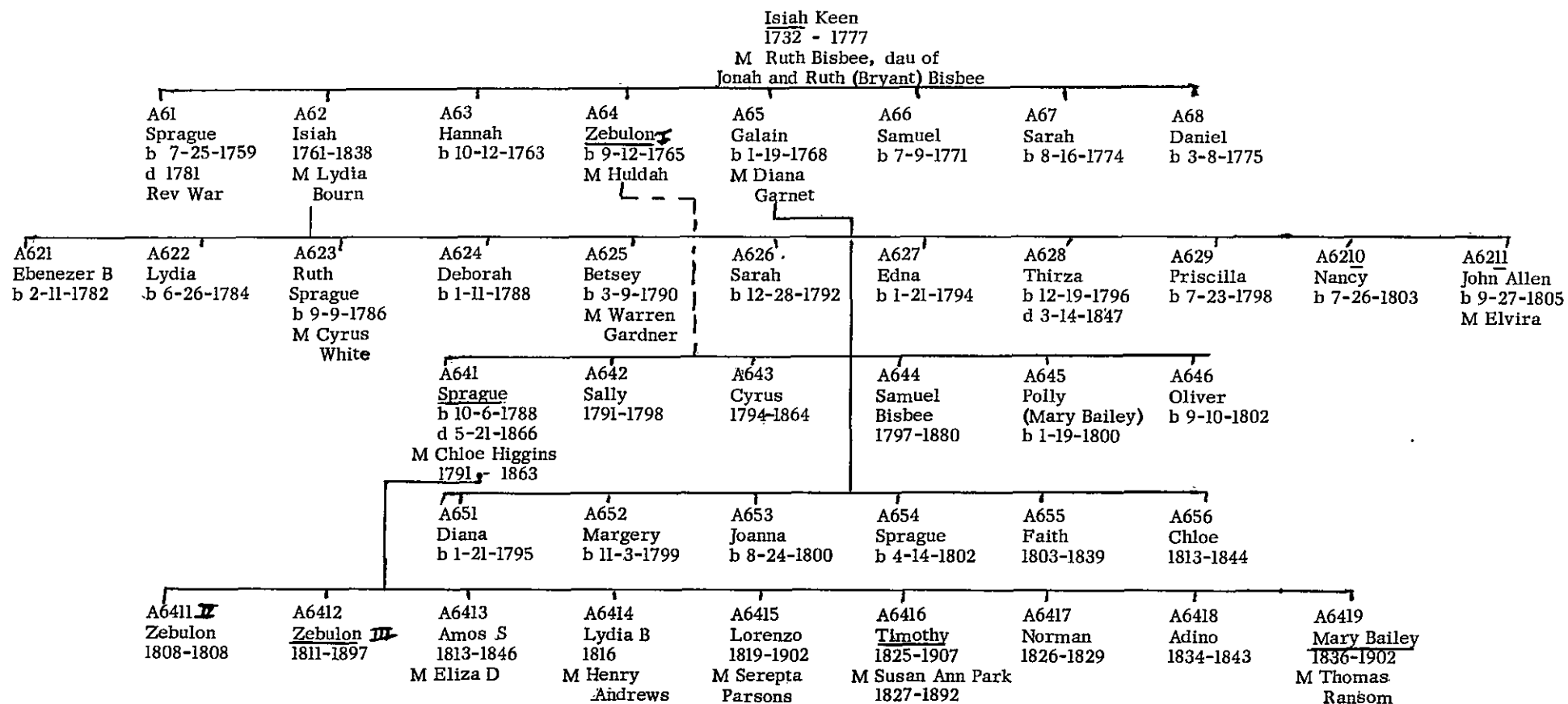

- A6 : Isaiah Keen, son of Samuel and Ruth (Sprague) Keen was born 1-19-1732/3, died 5-18-1777 at Pembroke. He married Ruth Bisbee, born 4-25-1739, died 1783; dau of Jonah and Ruth (Bryant) Bisbee; granddaughter of John and Mary (Oldham) Bisbee, born 1717, died 2-12-1800. They had eight children: (See Bisbee Family, page 69)
- A61 Sprague, b 7-25-1759, d 1781 on prison ship. Enlisted in Revolutionary War in 1777, served until 1779. His enlistment papers state "he was 5 ft. 7 in. tall and of light-complected."
- A62 Isaiah, b 8-19-1761, d 1-22-1838. He served in the Revolutionary War as a fifer in Capt. John Turner's Co., 1 mo., 14 da. Stationed at Little Compton, Rhode Island. Enlisted 7-24-1780. SPRAGUE KEEN NOTE BOOK

Sprague Keen, son of Zebulon and Hulda Keen, wrote a resume of his early life as experienced by him and his wife Chloe in their homesteading days near Homer, Cortland County, N.Y. It was addressed to Timothy and Susan Keen and written 6-24-1864 (or started then) just two years before his death in 1866. He elaborated upon his conversion to the Christian faith, claiming that while chopping down trees in his woods, one came perilously near striking him on the head, that it surely would have done so but for an act of God. They had many difficulties in acquiring cattle and land and actually lost one property after it was paid for, because of a fault in the negotiations or in the deed.

He wrote:

"About every man in the town Homer and Cortland had lived four years in Homer village worked at coopering which give me a chance to get acquainted with great many out in the country their was the county seat of business and that was where the regiment met for training and the two towns met before they were divided and celebrations of the fourth and other gatherings and within one mile and a half from their my father settled down in the woods when I was a little over seven years old amidst of all kinds of wild beasts and not but 12 or 15 families in the town ten miles square here I grew to 19 and I think I had a good chance to get acquainted with the inhabitants here I comeced in life for myself had nothing in the world but an acre and a wooman and she was as empty handed as myself and in starting I thought I would try to be honest and up to my word in my dealings with others for I had seen enough to make me think that honesty was the best policy."

"I had no horse for two years I think after I united with the Church for that reason your Mother could not goe very steady horses were very scarce in the neighborhood would get a chance to goe on horse back and Carry a baby in her arms and though that was a great privilege to get to meeting when we could both goe at a time would goe to one house but it was seldom that we could the oldest child was not old enough to take care of the youngest after Lydia was born and her Mother got Smart enough I hired a horse one Sunday to go to Homer to presterian Communion and present her baby for Sprinkling when we got ready to start she gave Lydia a dose of petragoric or Lodlom we started she on horse back and I trotting along by her side that was a common thing in those days to see and thought it was a fair thing too she set in one part of the house and I in another soon after meeting commenced I see your Mother and two or three others going out very fast I went and Lydia was in a fit went across the street to an old neighbors the old

lady had seen such cases before went to work got something down her took off the most of her clothes and washed and rubbed her all over she soon came out of her fit after a short time in a little more time by time meeting was over we began to gather up for a start home when we got their your Mother and baby were about used up" "She (the baby) had been asleep ever since we left home if I had (known) I should have been troubled about her for I though a good deal of my only daughter"

"Lydia was sick most all of one summer and your Mother quite all of one summer had to keep a hired girl through the summer employed Dr Goodger for our main phisition had others in to see her all this together made a heavy bill for me to pay then rite along Zebulon had his leg broke rather thigh broke employed Carpinter to set it and after it began to knit to gether we feared all was not rite and went for riggs he set it over and dressed and splintered it diferent from what it was before" "this was another bad blow it was hard to see him suffer as he did"

"I had burrow horse to ride in coming home down the hill west of homer he stumbled down on his knees throwing me off over his head flat on back and Swabling over me trying to get up I got up as soon as I could for I thought was no fun their for me I had some bruises but no broken bones thought my fortune a very hard one. I had let Zebulon and Amos off to learn trades Lorenzo not old enough to manage a team if I had one"

Memories of Mary Jane Keene Polhamus
written
June 1922

Many years ago near the town of McGrawville, in Cortland Co., N.Y., there lived a family by the name of Sprague Keene and his wife Cloe..They were well-to-do farmers. He was a man with many excellent qualities, well liked by all his neighbors and friends. I think if I am rightly informed, they were Baptists.

The Keene Family consisted of four sons and two daughters. The eldest son, Zebulon was a carpenter. He raised a large family. His wife, my mother, was Hannah Jane Webster. Left an orphan when young, she was adopted by a couple named Graves.

Lorenzo, the second son, was a noted Doctor. LaPorte, Ind., was his home for many years. Here he was well known and well loved. During the Civil War, he served as a war surgeon. After the war he returned to LaPorte and resumed his practice..

The third son, Amos, of which I knew but little, but think at the time of his sudden death, he and my father were in a grocery business in Mt. Morris, N. Y. State.

Timothy, the youngest son, lived with his father and mother and later came West with them.

Lidia, the eldest daughter, married a man by the name of Andrews. They came West and settled in Reedsburg, Sauk Co., Wisconsin. As far as I know she had one daughter whose name later became Palmer. She died leaving two daughters but all trace of them has been lost as far as I know.

Mary, the youngest daughter, who married Thomas Ransom, lived in your midst many years, and was well known and loved by all. Some of her descendants are here to-day.

In the intervening years, Sprague Keene, his wife and youngest son Timothy and family, came West and located near Valparaiso. Timothy lived with his parents until their death and continued on the home farm until he also died at an old age.

Sprague Keene and his sons all lived to the ripe old age of 80 years and over.

I do not know the nationality of Sprague Keene and his wife, but when they came west they were known as Down East Yankees.

Some of the sweetest memories of my childhood days were the visits to my Grandfather's farm. When I used to wander with my Aunt Mary, hand in hand over the farm place, spying out the many wonderful things you see on a farm. This was to me as a child, quite a novelty. I also liked to visit my Grandmother's pantry, which was always well stored with goodies. How well I remember the cookie jar, her delicious ginger bread and her wonderful cheeses. Also the sugar room where there was always a great supply of maple sugar, pure and lucius, to which we always had free access. She also made such great rolls of wonderful golden butter. Many times when I was about to depart for my home, she would wrap up a large roll of butter and say, "Here, Mary Jane, take this to your mother, but don't let Grandpa see it." We used to wonder why Grandmother said this because we knew Grandfather was just as willing as Grandma that Hannah should have the butter, but we would end up by saying, "That is just Grandmother's way."

Res. of Cortland Co., N.Y. until Nov. 1855 when they moved to a farm in Reedsburg, Wis., in the same general area as her Uncle Samuel Bisbee Keen and family settled, in Grant Co., near Lancaster. Fourteen years later the Andrew family moved to La Porte Ind., where Lydia's younger brother, Lorenzo Keen, M.D., practised medicine. The last three years of her life were spent with her daughter Mrs. Horace Smith in Reedsburg where she died in her seventy-ninth year.

In 1856 he settled in LaPorte, Ind. where he enjoyed a large practice. He enlisted in the Union Army in 1861 as Assistant Surgeon, in six months time he was promoted to the rank of Surgeon and assigned to Buell's Army Corps of the Cumberland. In 1863 he returned home to his own medical practice. He served as president of the LaPorte County Medical Society and belonged to the Baptist Church and the Masons.¹ An interesting Civil War experience of Dr. Keene (Uncle Dock) as told by Uncle Brayton Lee Keene; Dr. Keene was assigned, as surgeon in charge, of a field hospital set up in a Southern home, where he cared for wounded soldiers from the battlefield. One day following a battle when his patient-load was unusually heavy, he was summoned to the door by a military man and greeted with, "Who is in charge here?" "I am" replied Dr. Keene. "You are under arrest and under the Confederate flag." "Well," said the surgeon, "I don't know what you want with me, but be quick about it, I'm alone here with a group of wounded soldiers, from both the North and the South." Whereupon the doctor whirled about and returned to his surgery.

It was the doctor's habit to take an early morning walk daily, prior to breakfast. On one such occasion he heard sounds of battle over the hill. The idea of escaping came to him, accordingly, the next morning he arose earlier than usual dressed with his medical uniform over the top of his regular clothes, filling his pockets with instruments and other possessions and set out at his usual pace until he reached the top of the hill. He paused there to survey the surrounding area and seeing no one, he started running at top speed toward the direction of the battle sounds of the previous day. Eventually he found his freedom, his regiment and his pony.

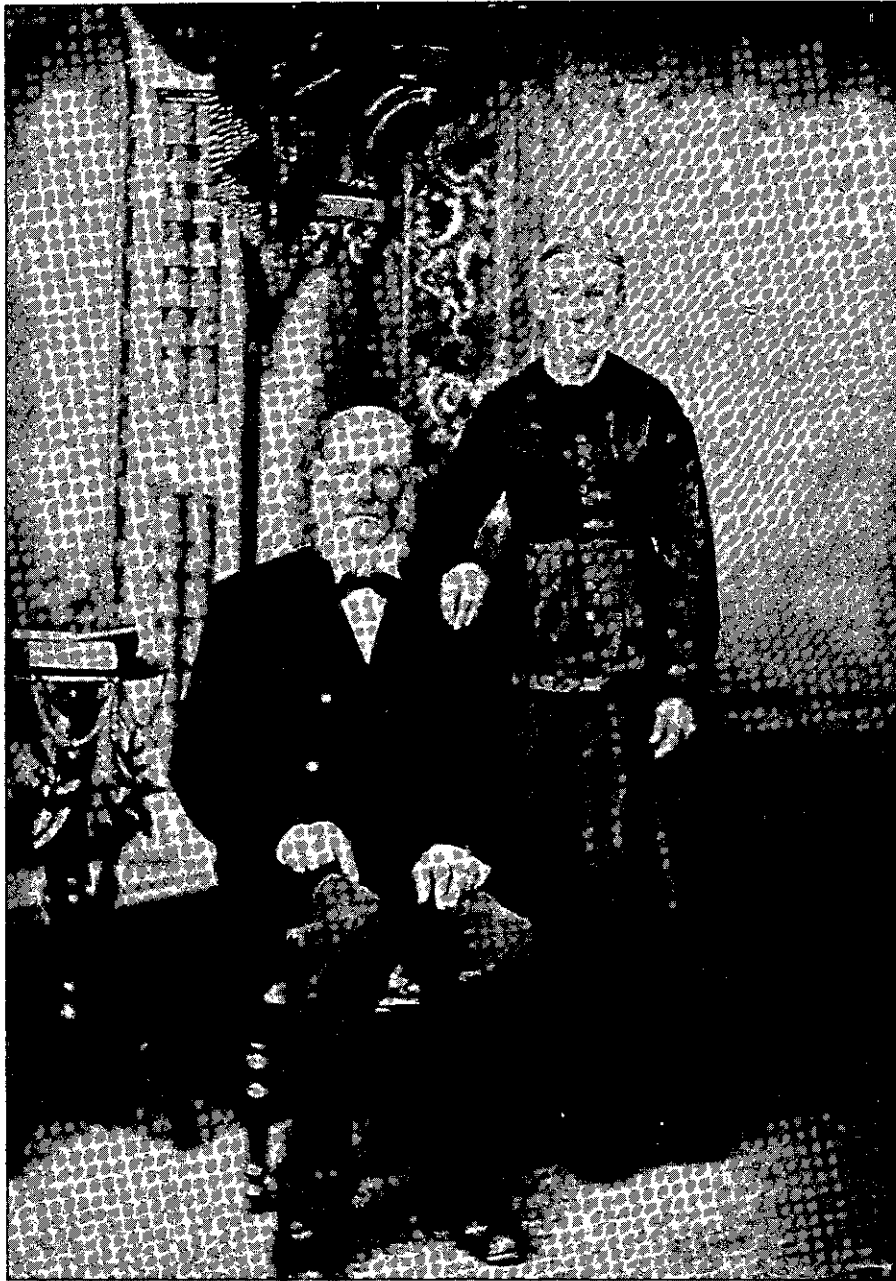

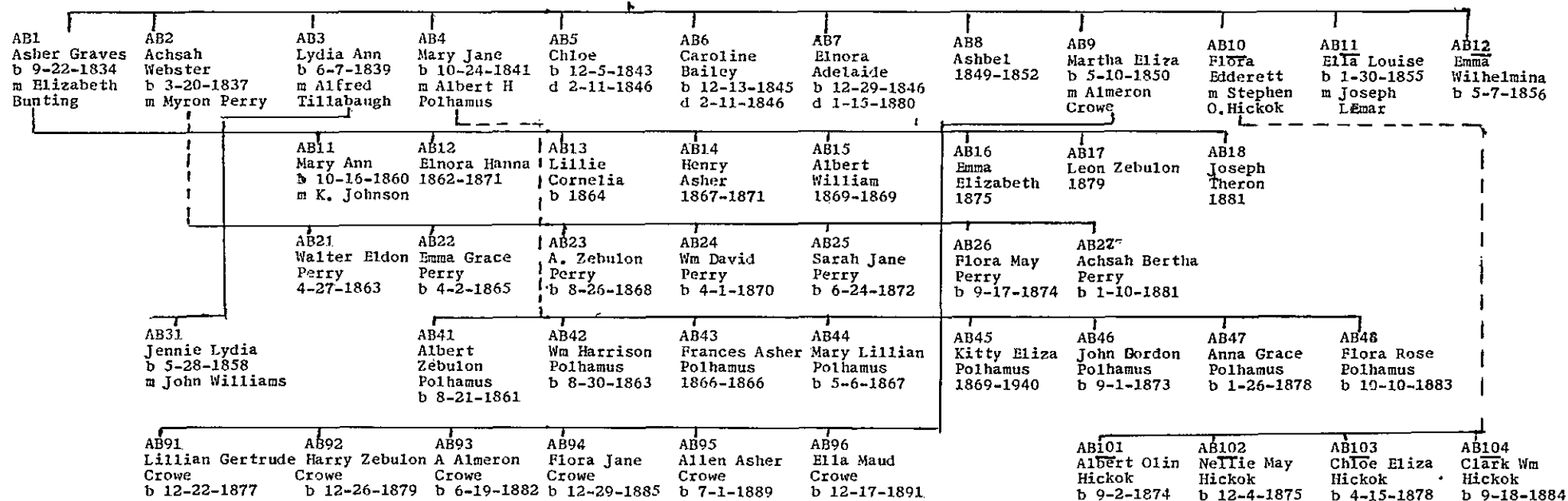

In 1865 they moved to Laporte and from there to Valparaiso in 1876 where they lived the rest of their lives. Both are buried in the old Valparaiso Cemetery and were members of the Baptist Church. 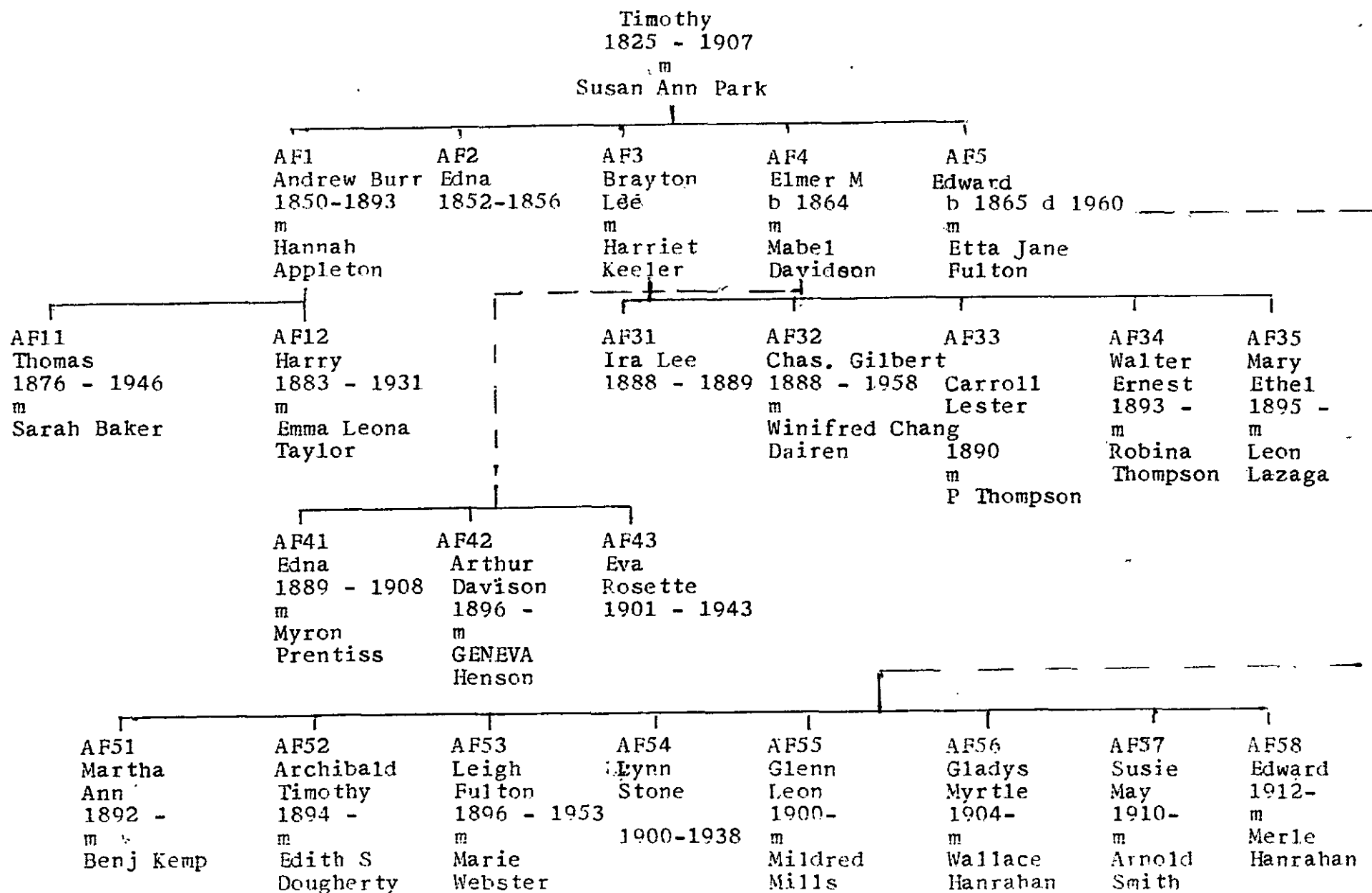

AF Timothy Keene, sixth child of Sprague and Chloe Higgins Keene, b 3-6-1825, MaGrawville, Cortland Co., N.Y., d 12-30-1907, Valparaiso, Ind. in his eighty-second year; bu Kimball Cemetery, near the city. M 5-9-1849 Susan Ann Park, teacher, b 9-3-1827, New York City, d 6-30-1892, dau of Lee and Mary (Gates) Park who were m 10-6-1816, Mystic, Conn. English descent. Timothy and family moved to Valparaiso in 1857, coming by rail to LaPorte, Ind., where his brother Lorenzo and w Sarepta lived. The rest of the way, twenty-two miles, was negotiated by wagon. Here he bought a farm of 130 acres and became a progressive farmer, clearing timber and draining swamp-land with tile, an innovation at that early date, he later purchased 40 acres from Lorenzo. The Keene descendants who migrated westward must have taken with them seed for planting where they settled. Timothy writes from Valparaiso to his parents in Cortland Co., N.Y., June 6, 1857. "My Indiana corn that was planted two weeks ago next Monday just begins to stick through the ground. My Yankee corn planted at the same time has been up for several days." (see page 73 for Park Family)

Timothy taught in the public schools, was appointed Commissioner of Education of the Porter County Schools about 1873, shortly after he was elected Superintendent of County Schools, serving in this capacity for about ten years. He wrote regularly articles for the farm journal, hoping to encourage more efficient methods in farming. He was secretary and treasurer of the Indiana State Grange at its inception, often writing letters long hand far into the night, they were then mailed the next morning by one of his sons who traveled the one and one-half miles by horse back, carrying the mail in a grain sack to the post office.

The family members were Baptists, active in Church work. Timothy was known as "Deacon Keene" because of his long years of service, having been deacon in the First Baptist Church of Valparaiso for 47 years. He was also superintendent of Sunday School and even led the singing with the use of a tuning fork, this before and after the church installed an organ. Even in his retirement years he was a regular church attendant, easily recognized by his long white curly hair, seated down front, center.

A peek into Timothy Keene's classroom at Cook's Corners Country School room, Valparaiso is given by John D. Collins, husband of Kitty (Polhamus) Collins who attended this school while Timothy Keene was its teacher about the year 1780. He relates: "Mr. Keene was hearing a geography class. A small boy in the back of the room was disturbing the other pupils. Without apparent notice and with the recitation moving right along, the teacher walked quietly to the back of the room, between double seats, down the wide aisle, never removing his eyes from the book. He stopped at the boy's desk, took him gently by the ear and marched him to the front of the room. Here the two stood while the teacher continued to hear the class. He then abruptly paused, looked at the boy for the first time and asked, 'What

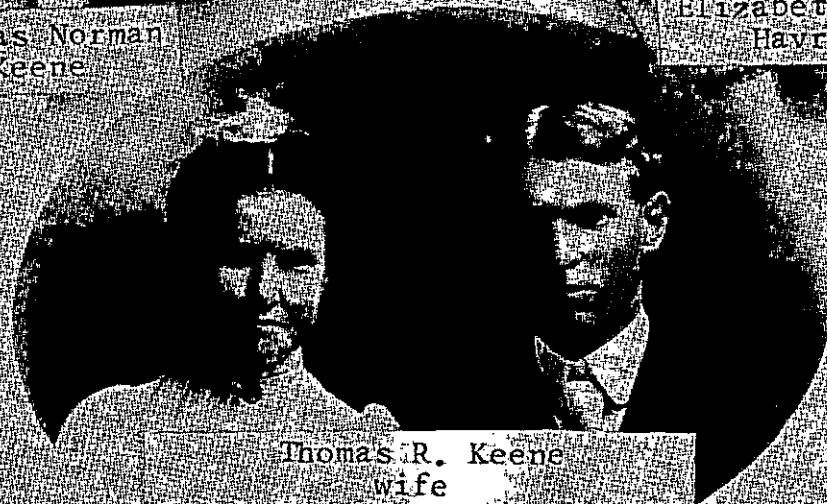

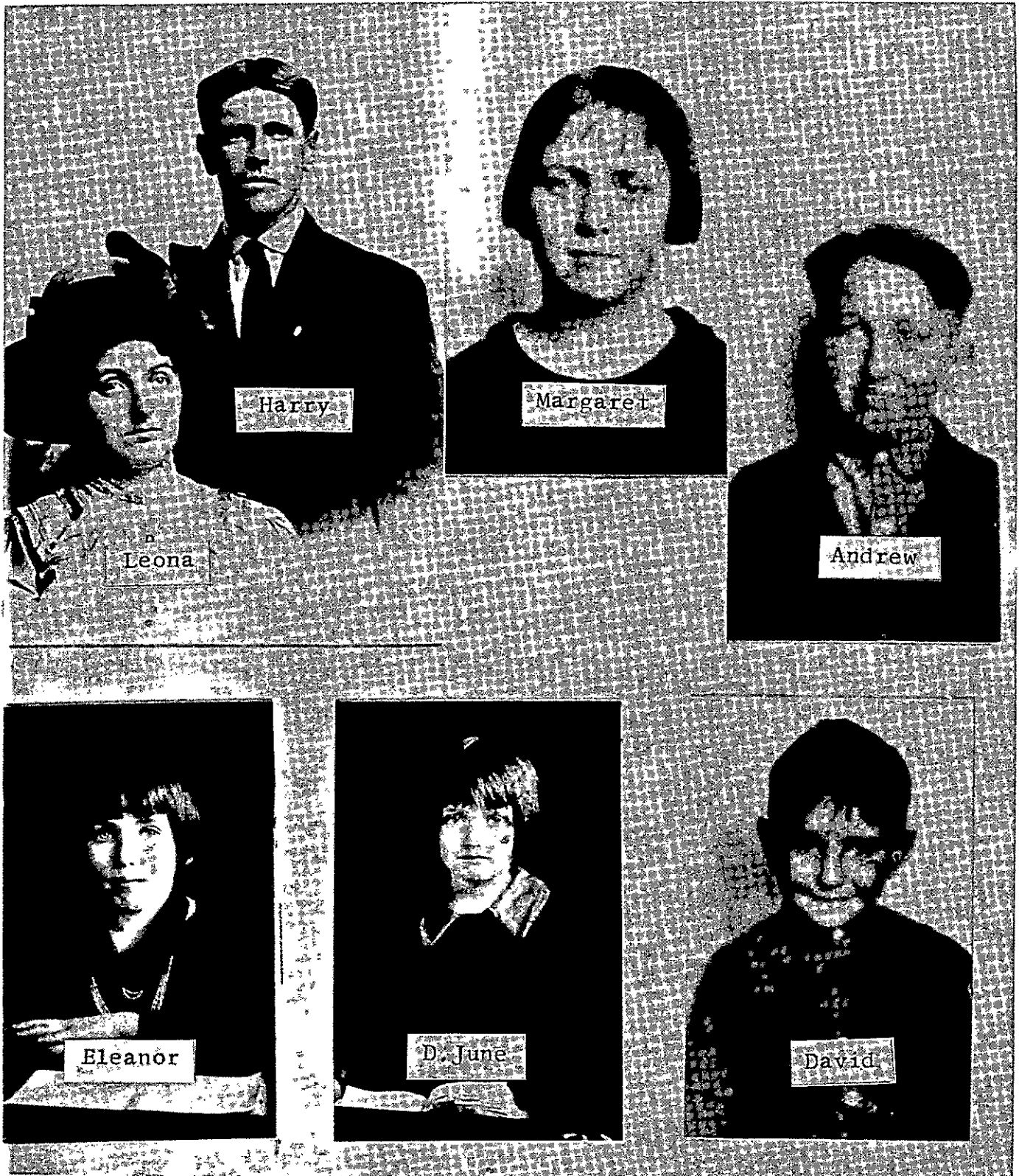

In 1913 the Chicago Press and the Valparaiso Vidette told of the sensational rescue of the entire J. A. Murvihill family (five children and the parents) by neighbor Edward Keene. He had been alerted in the middle of the night by the telephone operator, who had been called by Mrs. Murvihill. The house two blocks down the road was already in flames and the roof soon fell in. Mr. Keene dragged or carried each family member from the house and to safety, most of them were overcome by smoke inhalation, Mr. Keene was severely burned. At a later date the Murvihill family presented an award of merit to Mr. Keene for his valiant efforts of heroism in rescuing the entire family from their burning home, they felt their lives had been saved by his efforts.

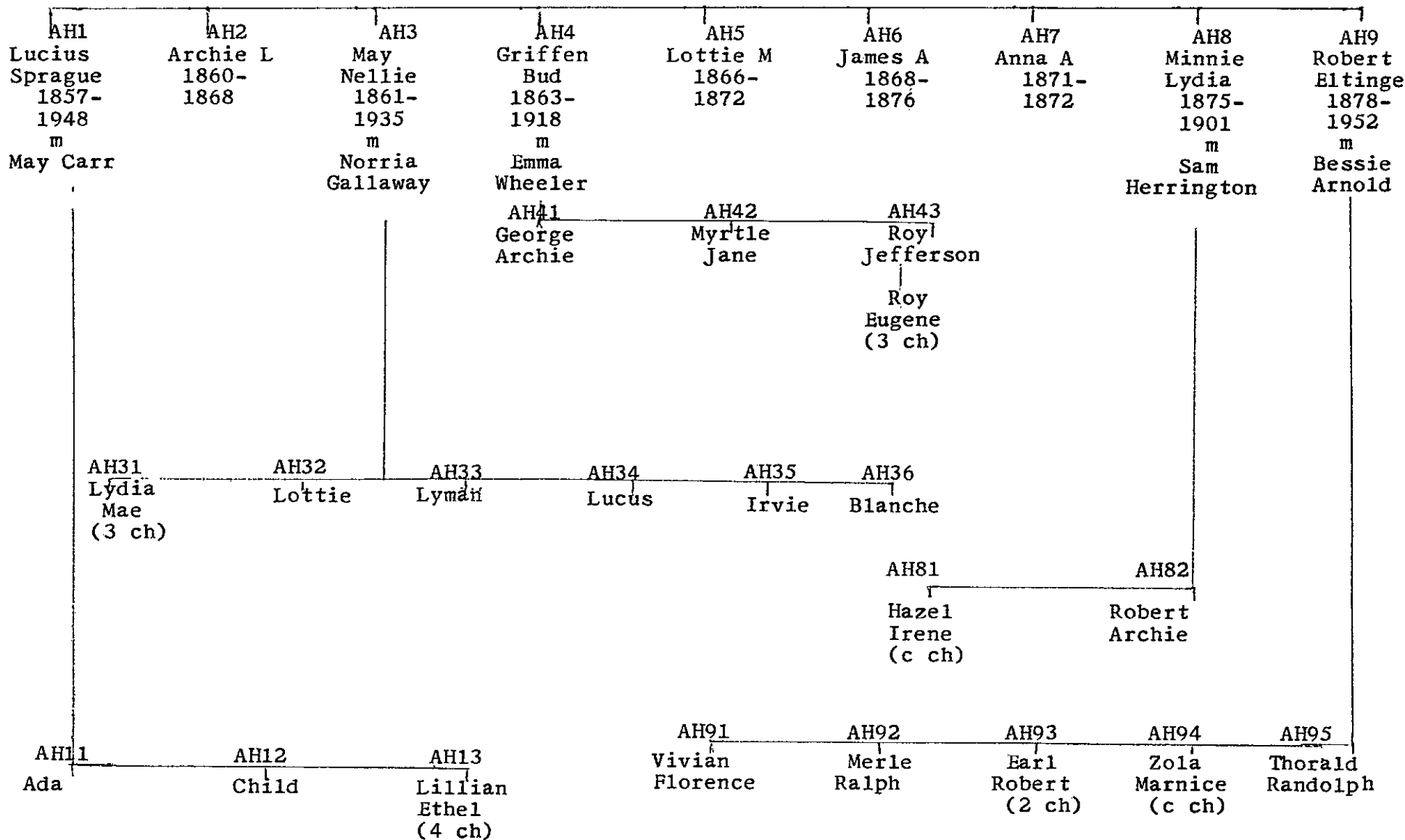

REMINISCENCE

In a copy of the Vidette-Messenger, a Valparaiso, Indiana newspaper of Nov. 16, 1962, an interesting resume of early experiences was found. It was related by a cousin, then of Arroro Grande, California, Hazel Irene Allen (AH81) daughter of Minnie Lydia Ransom and Samuel Knapp Herrington of Chesterton, Ind. Parts of it follow:

" ' My earliest recollection in 1904 is of a very long trip by horse and carriage, wrapped up in sheepskins and blankets, from where I lived with my Aunt Myrtle on the outskirts of Chicago to my grandfather Ransom's farm in Valparaiso for Christmas. The trip was too long. '

In referring to the high dunes at Lake Michigan, she recalled attending a Methodist church social there, which usually involved climbing a high hill on which were perched three ornate iron chairs. 'It was said that there was a prize for whoever could climb the hill and sit in one of them. I have since often wondered if anyone ever got a prize. Also, since the climb seemed so impossible, how did the chairs get there in the first place? '

Describing her experiences on the farm of her Uncle Elmer Herrington and Aunt Jennie, near Gary, she wrote, 'On the farm I met my first animals. Through the summer I managed to fall over a sleeping pig, stepped on a half grown chicken so it never walked straight again, a horse bit my fingers, a goose tore my dress and hen landed on my head and nearly scratched my hair out. '

'How many of you remember the horse drawn cars? Later the closed winter cars with masses of straw on the floors to soak up the snow and mud; the long curtains on the sides that were pulled down to keep the rains out; the old square yellow courthouse in Valparaiso, completely surrounded by hitching rails and seeing your first motor car in 1910? ' "

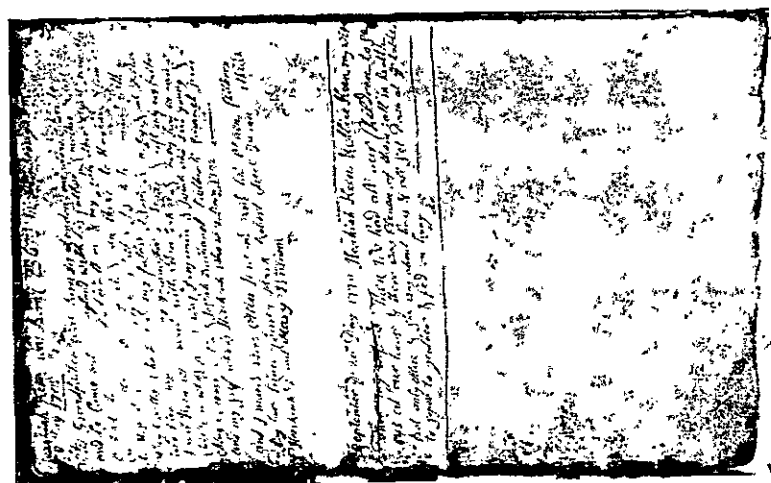
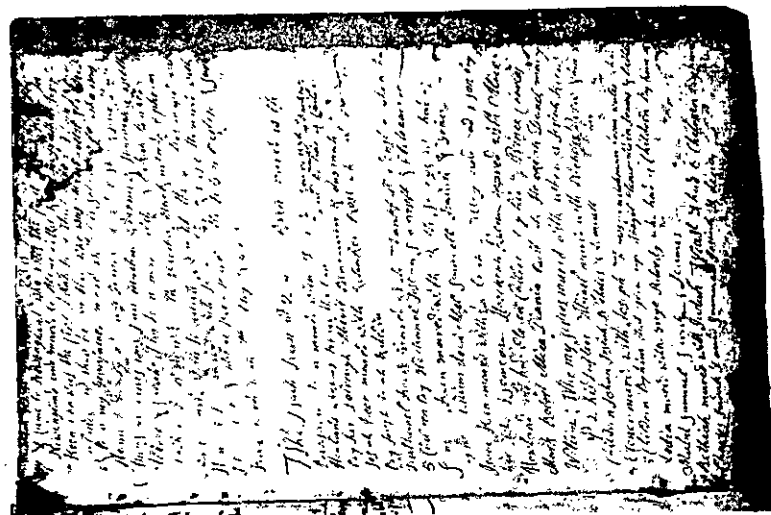

HEZEKIAH KEEN'S ACCOUNT BOOK WITH FAMILY RECORDS

BY GEORGE ERNEST BOWMAN

IN the illustration facing this page are reproduced two pages of an old account book, now the property of the Massachusetts Society of Mayflower Descendants, but originally owned by Hezekiah Keen, of Duxbury, Mass., who was born in 1702 and died in 1770. The pages face each other, in the original, but it was necessary to photograph them separately, on account of the binding of the book.

These two pages contain the only known evidence that Josiah Keen, of Marshfield and Duxbury, Mass., married Abigail Little, of Marshfield, who was the daughter of Thomas Little (of Plymouth and Marshfield) by his wife Anna Warren, daughter of Richard Warren, the Mayflower Passenger.

I called attention to this old account book in the July, 1906, issue of this magazine. One of Hezekiah Keen's great-great-grandsons, Mr. Abdon W. Keene of Winthrop, Mass., the owner of the book, had loaned it to me, so I could make, for the Massachusetts Society's files, exact copies of the family records entered by various members of the Keen family, beginning with Hezekiah Keen himself and including Mr. Abdon W. Keene.

In 1923 I suggested to Mr. George H. Partridge, of Minneapolis, Minn., then recently elected a member of this society and a descendant of Hezekiah Keen, the importance of ensuring the preservation of this valuable genealogical record by securing it for the Massachusetts Society of Mayflower Descendants, and he agreed to finance its purchase.

2 *Hezekiah Keen's Account Book With Family Records*

As Mr. Abdon W. Keene had retired, and was living at Camden, Me., I made a trip to that town to see him, and after a long correspondence with him the book finally became the property of the Massachusetts Society, in 1925, as a gift from Mr. George H. Partridge.

The book has side covers of a dark hard wood, 13 by 8½ inches, and about three-eighths of an inch thick at the back, and one-fourth of an inch at the front edge.

The back was made of two pieces, each 13 inches tall, 2½ inches wide at the top, and 2½ inches at the bottom. The inner strip is about three eighths of an inch thick, and the outer is seven sixteenths.

The covers are fastened to the back by hand-made iron hinges about 7½ inches long, riveted to the wood.

Inlaid on the back is the monogram "HK", in brass; and "Hezekiah Keen", in brass, was inlaid on the inside of the front cover, at the top.

Originally the book could be locked by a brass clasp and staple, but the padlock was lost long ago.

An old fashioned separate index of twenty-four pages, 12½ by 3½ inches, containing also a few business notes, is laid loosely in the book.

A few leaves have been lost, but there are still 478 pages, 214 of them blank, except for the page numbers.

Numerous entries by Hezekiah Keen testify to the ownership of the book.

On the first page, in a bold hand, he wrote, in red ink:

"Hezekiah Keen of Duxbrough".

At the top of the fifth page we find, written in red ink:

"Hezekiah Keen his Hand Ret By me With the Sprengs of my one fengers & y^e veins of my one Hands In April y^e 12th: 1763"

At the top of the third page from the end of the book we find:

"Hezekiah Keen His Book Ret by me in March y^e 10th 1763 who then Leved in Duxbrough & then was, In his Sixty first year of my age &c

"Hezekiah Keen His Book Ret in March 1763

"This is my Name Ret By me In my one Hous"

On the last page is written:

"Hezekiah Keen in y^e 63 year of my Age & I was Born In August y^e 6 old Stile Day 1702 & In new Stile august y^e 17 1702"

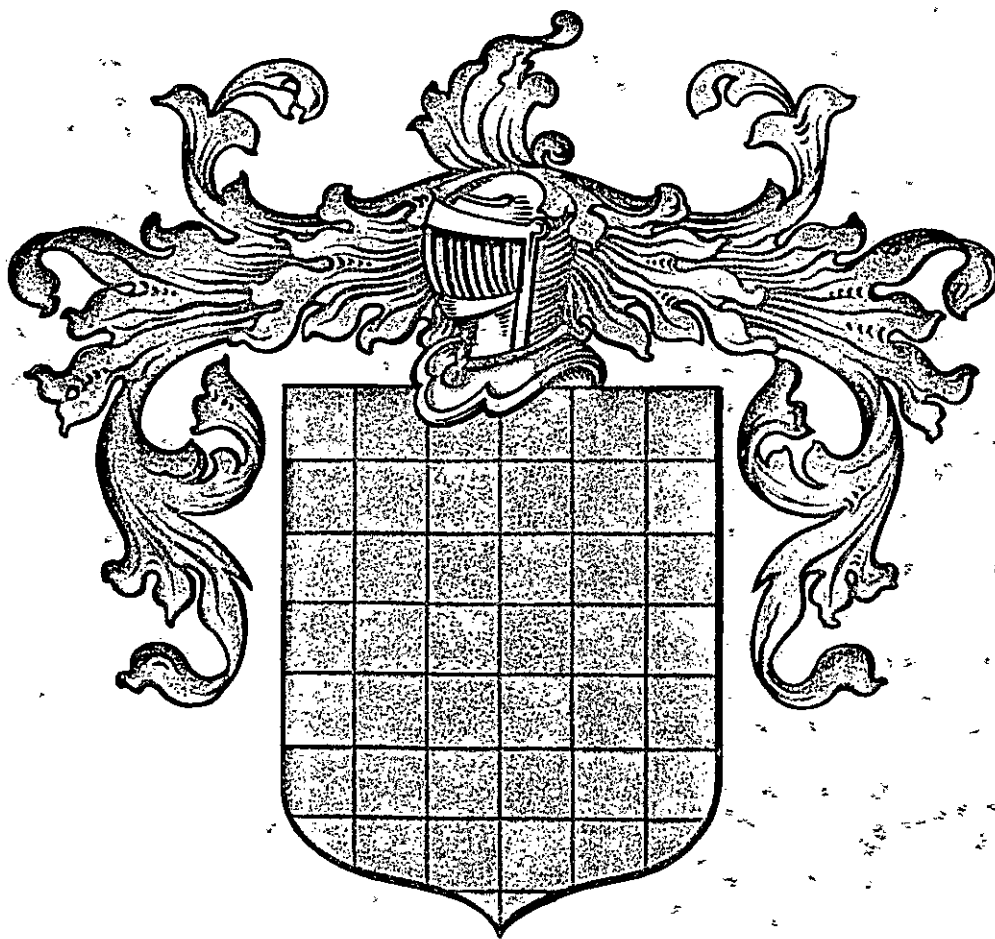

In interest and antiquity the history of the Warren family is exceeded by that of no other in England. The surname Warren is of Norman-French origin, and is derived from Garenne, or Gareme, a small river in the old county of Calilas, or Caux, in Normandy, which gave its name to the neighboring commune. There is at present a village called Garenne in the same district, and it is here that the origin of the family has been fixed by historians. The ancient Baronial seat of the DeWarrenes stood on the west side of the river Garenne, and as late as the year 1832 some of the ruins were standing. The surname has assumed different forms from time to time--Garcyn, Warreyn Waryn, Warin, Waring, Warynge, Waryng and Warren. It first appears in England with William de Warrene, a Norman nobleman, who came to England with William the Conqueror, and was related to him both by marriage and common ancestry. An ancient genealogy of the family traces the lineage of this William de Warrene back to the year 900 A.D., when his Scandinavian ancestors are said to have settled in Normandy. The Scandinavian origin of the Norman family is conceded by eminent genealogists, and the following pedigree with slight variations, is accepted by authorities on the Warren history.

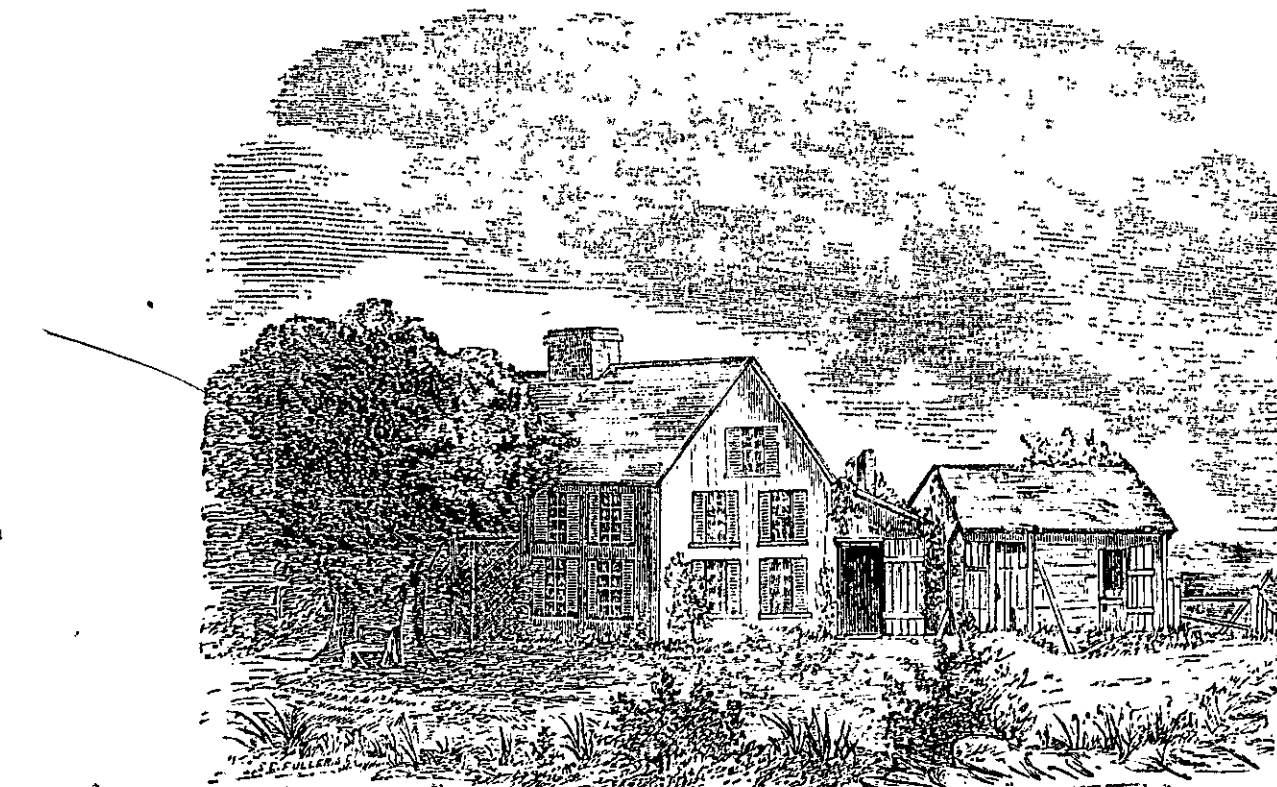
- I The Progenitor, a Danish knight, was among those who succeeded in obtaining a footing in Normandy, and became allied through marriage with some of the foremost families of the noble lineage of Europe.
- II Herfastus, son of the progenitor
- III A daughter, married Walter de Saint Martin
- IV William de Warren, Earl of Warren in Normandy, married a daughter of Ralph de Torta.
- V William de Warren, son of William de Warren, married Gundred, daughter of William the Conqueror, and became the first Earl of Warren and Surrey in England
- VI William de Warren, second Earl of Warren and Surrey, married Isabel of the fifth Earl of Vermandois, in France.
- VII Reginald Warre, son of William de Warren, married Adelia de Mowbray, daughter of Roger de Mowbray.
- VIII William Warren only son of Reginald Warren, married Isabel de Hayden, daughter of Sir William de Hayden, Knight.
- IX Sir John Warren, only son and heir, married Alice de Townsend, daughter of Roger de Townsend, Esquire.
- X John Warren, son and Heir, married Joan de Port, dau. of Sir Hugh de Port, Knight.
- XI Sir Edward Warren married Maud de Skeyron daughter of Richard de Skeyron (Skegeton)
- XII Sir Edward Warren married Cicely de Eaton, daughter of Nicholas de Eaton, Knight.
- XIII Sir John Warren, only son, married Agnes de Wynnington, daughter of Richard de Wynnington, Knight.

- XIV Sir Lawrence Warren, only son and heir, married Margery Bulkely, daughter of Hugh Bulkely, Esquire, of Ware, in Shropshire, ancestor of the Bulkelys of New England.

The Family in America

1. Richard Warren, son of Christopher and Alice (Webb) Warren, came to the American Colonies in the historic "Mayflower" Company, which founded Plymouth, Mass., in 1620, although he was not of the Leyden company. The register at the end of Gov. Bradford's folio manuscript gives him the honorable prefix of "Mr.." He was mentioned by a contemporary as "grave Richard Warren, a man of integrity, justice and uprightness, of piety and serious religion," and also "as a useful instrument during the short time he lived, bearing a deep share in the difficulties and troubles of the plantation." He received land grants in common with his associates, and one of these grants was at Warren's Cove. He was one of the influential members of the company, and as such was selected with nine others to cruise along the coast from Cape Cod Harbor in a shallop for the purpose of deciding a place of settlement. His death occurred at Plymouth in 1628. His wife, Elizabeth, whom he married in England, followed him to America in the ship "Ann," in 1622, bringing with her their five daughters. She died at Plymouth 10-2-1673, aged about ninety years. Their children:- Mary, died after 1676, married in 1628 Robert Bartlett; Ann b abt 1612, married 4-19-1633 Thomas Little & lived in Marshfield; Sarah married 3-28-1634 John Cooke who was the last survivor of the Mayflower; Elizabeth, died 3-4-1670, married abt 1635 Richard Church; Abigail, d after 1685, married 11-8-1629 Anthony Snow; Nathaniel, b 1624/5; Joseph, b ere 3-22-1627, d 5-4-1689, m Priscilla Faunce, daughter of John Faunce in 1651/2.

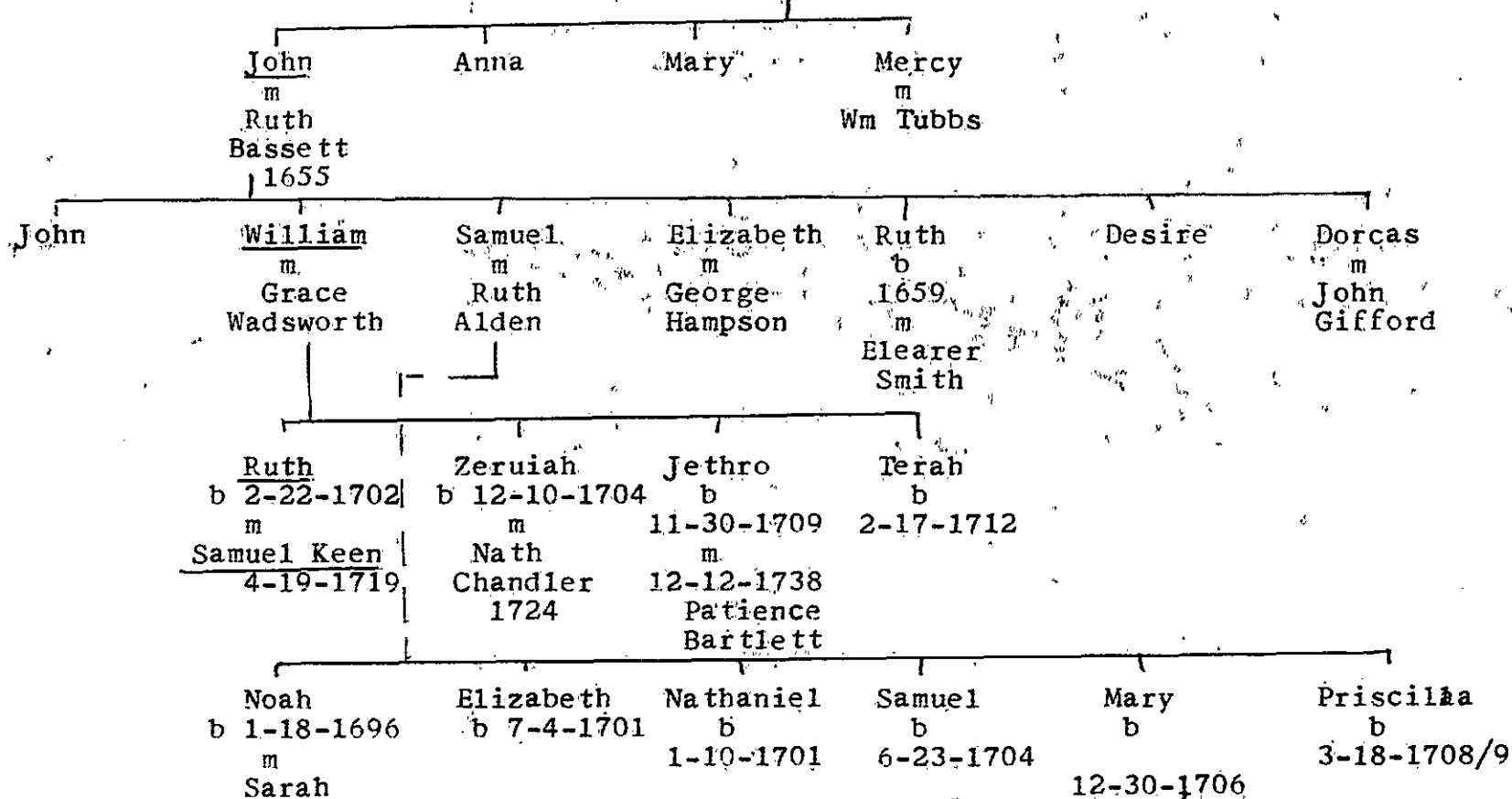

The Sprague Family

Francis Sprague arrived in Plymouth, Mass. in 1623, with his wife Lydia and daughters on the good ship "Anne" a ship commanded by Wm. Pierce and the same one in which the wife and five daughters of Richard Warren came. In 1637 he was admitted Freeman of the Colony, he owned considerable property and was licensed to sell spirituous liquors, was an Inn Holder as late as 1666. Mr. Sprague did not adhere strictly to the civic code of the Puritan fathers and was several time brought before the Court. His independence did not fully meet with the principles of the Puritans. He must have been a person of worth and great respectability. His children were: Ann and Mary (one of whom married Robert Lawrence) Mercy, m 11-9-1637 William Tubbs, Dorcas, m 10-26-1659 Ralph Earle, and John.

John Sprague, married in 1655 Ruth Basset, dau of William and Elizabeth (Tilden) Basset. They resided for a time in Marshfield, their dau Ruth was born there. He was slain in Pierce's fierce fight at Pawtucket in Phillip's War, 3-26-1676. His widow afterward married a Mr. Thomas. They had seven children: John, b abt 1656; William; Ruth, b 2-12-1659, m 8-12-1680 Elizer Smith of Dartmouth; Eliza, m George Lampson; Desire, b abt 1665, m 11-24-1696 John Gifford of Sandwich, Mass.; Samuel b abt 1670, m Ruth Alden and Dorcas, m 1-10-1710 Joseph Hatch of Falmouth.

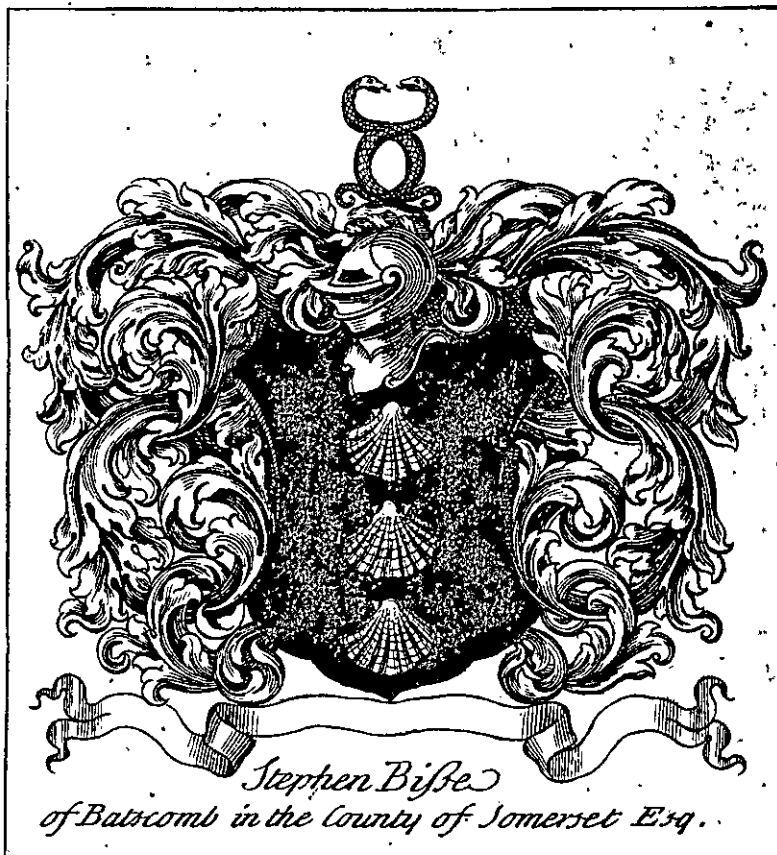

She was buried in Biddenden Jan. 1, 1619. Their children were:

To Richard Foster and Patience, his wife, Thomas Foster and Elizabeth, his wife and Thomas Stocke and his wife, to each a gold ring, of value 10s.

To young John Beale, my godschild, 20s.

The residue of my goods and chattels, unbequeathed, to my two sons, John Besbich and Thomas Besbeech, and them I make my executors.

My will Regarding My Lands

To my wife, Dorothy, for her dowry, 20 pounds a year out of my lands, but if she marry again, only 14 pounds.

Thomas Besbedge

Thomas Besbedge, the common ancestor of the New England Family of Bisbee, was the son of John and Dorothy (Austin, Foster) Besbeech. He was born in Biddenden, County Kent, England, was baptised, All Saints Church, Mar. 3, 1589/90; died in Sudbury, Mass. Mar. 9, 1673/4; married in Biddenden to Anne Baseden, who died in Frittenden, County Kent, England, Apr. 21, 1634. In 1635 he sailed to New England on the ship "Hercules". He had obtained a certificate of conformity as required by law in order to emigrate. He took with him his two daughters and seven servants. He apparently was a man of some wealth and position in the old country, and a man of influence in Plymouth Colony. He became a member of Lothrop's Church, the first gathered at

Scituate, and was chosen one of its first deacons. (Elder Nathaniel Tilden, ruling elder of this church, had also come on the "Hercules.") He remained in Scituate but a short time, for in 1638 he bought a house of Wm. Palmer in Duxbury and moved there. In 1643 he was chosen Representative from Duxbury to the General Court. He was one of the grantees of Seipicon, (now Rochester) but the grant was not accepted and Mr. Bisbee subsequently moved to Marshfield, where his name appears on a petition to the General Court. He afterwards moved to Sudbury, where he lived several years before his death. His will, dated Nov. 25, 1672, bequeaths all his houses and lands to Hedcorn and Frittenden, Old England, to his grandson, Thomas Brown, and makes two other grandsons, William and Edward Brown, executors. Webster Family

Webster, as a surname is derived from the Anglo-Saxon webbestre, meaning a female weaver, thus is of occupational origin. John Webster was the progenitor of Noah Webster, the lexicographer, who claimed, in part that the Websters settled in Yorkshire at an early period, held the manor of Lockington, Yorkshire in the time of Richard II(1389-99). The family was founded by John Webster, of Bolver. One of his descendants, also named John Webster received large grants of land from Henry VI upon the dissolution of the monasteries (1509-47). From him is descended in the third generation the John Webster who came to New England from England about 1630.

John had married Agnes Smith in England November 7, 1609 and she came with him to Massachusetts around 1630. He removed to Hartford, Conn. and in 1636 was listed as one of the original proprietors. He was one of ten out of 153 original settlers accorded the honor of being addressed as "Mr." He held many high governmental offices and as Governor of the Colony in 1656.

His will recorded in Northhampton, Mass., mentioned his wife Agnes; sons Matthew, William, Thomas, Robert; daughters Marsh, Markham and Mary. His wife survived him by six years.

Robert Webster, his son also held many public offices in Middletown, Conn. Served in the War of 1675. He married in 1652 Susannah Treat, said to have been the daughter of Richard and Alice (Gaylord) Treat who were married in England, April 27, 1615. She died in 1705. In her will the children are named as; John, Sarah, Jonathan Susannah, Samuel, Robert, Joseph, Benjamin, William, Mary and Elizabeth, the first four were born in Middletown, the rest in Hartford.

From Jonathan the line follows thru Jonathan, Jonathan, the miller Ashbel, Ashbel to the father of Hannah, another Ashbel. This Ashbel, a farmer, was born Feb. 15, 1783, died at the home of his parents March 7, 1823. He married 1st at DeRuyter, Madison Co., N.Y., Nov. 2, 1804, Lois Page who died there June 17, 1807. He married 2nd Avis Burton who was born Sept. 15, 1791. She died April 9, 1820 in Susquehanna Co., Pa. Children by first wife, Justin Page, b 9-18-1805. By second marriage: Jerus Lamphere b 3-16-1809, Eliza Lucretia, b 4-25-1811, Mercy b 3-3-1814, Hannah Jane, b 9-15-1816, Madison Co., N.Y., John Burrton b 2-15-1819. These children, orphans, were raised by friends and relatives.
