THE HENRY SAMSON FAMILY

172. RUTH BISBEE³ (Mary Oldham¹, Meny Sprout³, Elizabeth² Samson, Henry³), daughter of John Bisbee and his wife Mary Oldham [43], was born probably at Marshfield about 1712, the first child of her parents and her birth unrecorded. She was living on 3 April 1762 when she signed a deed with her husband.

She married 9 May 1733 at Pembroke (VR 238, 241), JOB BONNEY, who was born about 1710 and baptized 26 April 1713 at Pembroke (VR 42), son of James and Abigail (Bishop) Bonney (NEHGR 89:221). His sister Ruth married her brother John Bisbee [#189].

Job Bonney and Ebenezer Bonney, both of Pembroke, on 30 March 1757 quitclaimed to Ichabod Bonney of Pembroke their rights in the 25th and 29th lots of cedar swamp in the second division of commons that belonged to the towns of Duxbury and Pembroke; the deed was acknowledged 15 March 1762 and recorded 12 September 1765 (Plymouth LR 51:12). Job Bonney of Pembroke, housewright, on 3 April 1762 sold, for £500, to Jedediah Beals "of a Place called the Country Grant adjoining to Hardwick in the Country of Worcester ... husbandman," 44 acres in Pembroke, part of the 17th and 44th lots in the Major's Purchase, along the highway leading from Pembroke to Halifax; Ruth also signed, using her mark, and the deed was acknowledged the same day and recorded 29 October 1765 (Plymouth LR 51:219). The fact that both deeds were recorded in the fall of 1765 suggests that Job may have died shortly before.

The family probably removed from Pembroke to Hardwick around 1762, but no further record of them has been found. Neither Job nor Ruth is listed as head of a household in the 1790 census in Massachusetts. There are no probate records for them in Plymouth or Worcester Counties.

- iii BENJAMIN BONNEY, bp. 6 May 1739 Pembroke (VR 39); d. 4 Sept. 1803 Chesterfield, ac 64 (White, 1:321); m. (1) Pembroke, 3 April 1759 (VR 240), SILENCE WHITE, b. 13 Oct. 1737, dan. Nathan White, d. 1764 Chesterfield, the first person to die there (Chesterfield Cem., 1235A); m. (2) 29 Nov 1765 Killingly, Conn., HANNAH DAY, b. there 5 Sept. 1746 (Barbour, 232, 233), d. 21 March 1839 Hamilton, N.Y. (pension rec.) "on the Bonney Farm," ac 92, dau. The will of David Day of Worthington, yeoman, dated 21 Oct. 1785, proved 21 Oct. 1787, names among others daughter Hannah Bonney and appoints son-in-law Benjamin Bonney executor (Hampshire PR 15:225). Benjamin served in the Revolution and in the Mass. Legislature, and was one of the first selectmen of the town of Chesterfield (Chesterfield Fam., 56). Hannah applied for a widow's pension 23 Nov. 1838, living then with her widowed daughter-in-law in Hamilton, N.Y. Only two children, David and Walter, survived their father Benjamin F Bonney, probably a grandson, was adm. of Hannah's estate in Madison Co., N.Y., in 1839 (pension rec.).

v LEVI BONNEY, b. ca 1743; d. 24 May 1824 prob. Canaan, N.Y.; m. Cornwall, Conn., 4 Oct. 1764 (Barbour, 301), MARY MAY, b. 25 Dec. 1746, dau. Edward May. He was a carpenter and farmer and served in both the French and Indian War and in the Revolution. The family moved from Salein, Washington Co., N.Y., to Hamilton, N.Y., and later to Homer, Cortland Co., where their daughter Lucretia lived (Bonney Gen., 27).

RUTH BONNEY, b. 1746; d. 12 April 1809 Chesterfield, ac 63; m. Hardwick, 24 Feb. 1767 (VR 147), ABIEL STETSON, b. Schuate 23 Oct. 1738, son of Anthony and Anna (Smith) Stetson (VR 1:348, 2:266), d. Chesterfield 28 Aug. 1819. Stelson Gen. quotes their grandson: "My grandfather wintered in Chesterfield the first winter, in company with a man named Benjamin Bryant, also from Schuate; and I have heard him say that they lived in a log house, covered with bark—obliged to watch, and keep a good fire burning all night, to prevent freezing to death."

jOB BONNEY, bp. 22 April 1750, Second Church, Pembroke (VR 42); d. by 1 May 1801 when adm. on his estate was granted to his widow (Worcester PR #6246); m Ware 3 Nov. after int. 1 Sept. 1772 (VR 44, 207), CHRISTEN TACKLES, who d. Brookfield, "Christian w. of Job," 6 July 1829 ac 82 and is buried in Ragged Hill Cemetery, Brookfield (VR 466). His m. rec. calls him "of a gore of land adjoining Ware"; it was prob. his sister Elizabeth who m. James Tackels the same year. They are not found in 1790 census, but in 1800 res. Hardwick, Job and wife 45+, 1 young woman and 1 young man 16-26, 2 boys 10-16, and 1 little girl under 10 (p.295).

Inventory of Job's estate taken 7 Aug. 1804 included 61 acres with dwelling and barn in Hardwick on the east side of the Ware River, and one other piece of land in Ware (Worcester PR 223:214). Dower was set off to Christina [sid] Bonney 23 Oct. 1804 by Asa Barns, John Bleason, and Ephraim Adams (sid, 34:26-27), and on the same day Elijah Clapp was appointed guardian of minors William and Job Bonney (Worcester PR Files 6247, 6249).

He is listed at Ware in 1790 with a household consisting of a man over 16, 3 boys under 16, and 2 females (Heads of Fam., 126).

Luke was clerk of the Baptist Church in Chesterfield in 1"89, and a delegate to the convention that formed the State Constitution 1"79 1"80. Capt. Luke Bonnev is listed in the 1790 census at Chesterfield with 1 man over 16, 6 boys under 16, and 3 females (Heads of Fam., 106).

173. JOHN BISBEE⁵ (Mary Oldham¹, Mercy Spront³, Elizabeth² Samson, Henry¹), son of John Bisbee and his wife Mary Oldham [43], was baptized at Scituate 7 November 1714 (VR 1:35). The death of "Deacon John Bisbee" on 6 September 1760 was recorded by the Rev. Gad Hitchcock of the Second Church, Pembroke (now Flanson), along with that of his brother Gideon who died in the army (NEHGR 136:34).

He married 6 September 1733 at Pembroke (VR 238), ABIAH BONNEY, daughter of James and Abigail (Bishop) Bonney, and sister of Job Bonney who married John's sister Ruth Bisbee [#188].* Abiah was born 4 May 1712 at Pembroke (I'R 38), and died after 23 March 1749/50 when her last known child was born.
